As a public agency in Sweden tasked with producing economic forecasts, conducting economic analysis, and supporting policymaking, the National Institute of Economic Research (NIER) publishes an annual report series on environmental-economic policy topics of choice. These reports are grounded in the scientific literature and use quantitative analysis to evaluate the environmental and economic impacts of different policies. For instance, the 2023 report analyzed the income-distributional effects of climate policies in Sweden (see NIER, 2023).
